The institution was established on 1st of September, 1970 to cater to the educational and cultural needs for the people of a locality stretching to the rural neighborhood in the western fringe of the town of Chandannagar. The establishment was possible because of the initiative taken by some pious and philanthropic persons. In the initial years of the journey the college achieved the recognition of the UGC under 2F and 12B, and got the affiliation under the University of Burdwan. The early years witnessed the excellence of the College in National Service Scheme and in the establishment of Hooghly District Blood Donors Society. From the last two decades of the last century Khalisani Mahavidyalaya have expanded their horizon and introduced various subjects in both Honours and General courses in B.A., B.Com. and B.Sc. streams. The College is now providing 12 Honours courses, apart from 4 courses in the general stream to almost 1000 students for each session who are coming from a large feeder zone comprising of the urban settlements like Chandannagar, Chinsurah, Bandel, and the rural areas of Singur. Majority of the students passed from the institutions are at present well established citizens in various facets of professions. The National Assessment and Accreditation Council accredited the College with Grade B in the year 2008.



Our College is not so large. Both the infrastructure and human resource is limited. Still the College is doing its job adequately to fulfill the needs of the stakeholders, i.e., the students. The results in all the undergraduate courses, particularly in the Honours subjects are much higher than the University average. I feel glad to inform that seven students of Bengali Honours secured 1st class in Part-I University Examination last year. We are thinking of introducing a new method of internal evaluation from this academic session for the academic gain of our students. Following the instructions of the Government of West Bengal the College is introducing On-line admission process from this year. We have already making the office automated which will enable smooth working in the administrative activities. I also feel fortunate to inform that we are going to re-introduce one Unit of the National Service Scheme from this academic session. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell as per the guidelines of NAAC has been constituted with Dr. Arghya Bandyopadhyay, a distinguished scholar himself, as its coordinator to look over the overall

development of the College. Last year we have completed 2nd Cycle of NAAC and Re-accredited Grade B++ with CGPA score 2.77. More and more developments in the academic arena are expected. I welcome all the aspirant students in our College.
